

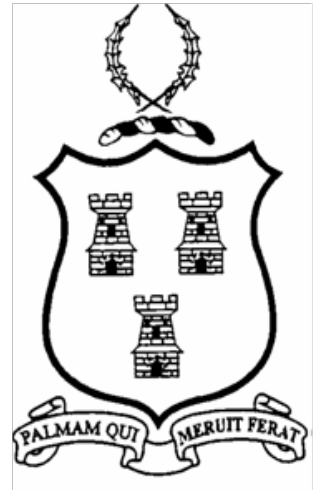

Geography Field Trips

Over the past two weeks both the Grade 10 and Grade 11 Geography classes have been out on their field trips.

Both groups are to be commended on their hard work and good behaviour on the trips. The Grade 10s went around the peninsula, looking at the influence of the geological structure on the landscapes that we visited.

We stopped off at Signal Hill, Three Anchor bay, Sea Point, Clifton, Camps bay and Hout Bay and the girls really enjoyed seeing the theoretical knowledge they had gained in class, displayed in the real world.

The Grade 11s went to Cape Point where thankfully it was a little cooler than anywhere else on the Peninsula that day. We had a

lovely walk through the coastal fynbos and then down (and up) about 250 wooden steps to the magnificent Diaz beach.

Here we observed the stacks, the fossil dunes, raised wave-cut platform and tested whether the waves were constructive or destructive by timing them.

The walk continued along the impressive 60m high cliff path where we could look back at the light house and the arches at the base of the rock, ending up at the wonderful look out position on top of the Cape of Good Hope.

On both trips the girls learnt a huge amount while having a lot of fun with their peers and getting a bit of exercise.

We hope to conclude the Symposium with some improvisation. That will be interesting indeed.

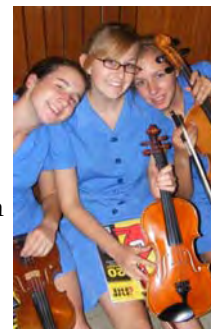

Personality of the Month: Nomaswati Sopotela, Design Winner



It all started when Educational Activist and Design Guru, Suné Stassen came to Rustenburg with a proposal. She spoke to the art and design students and all those who were interested in taking part in the Woolworths Making a Difference through Design Competition.

The brief was to design an emblem that would represent South Africa. This emblem was to be a piece of graphic design with a vintage and heritage slant. Five Rustenburg students took part in the competition.
