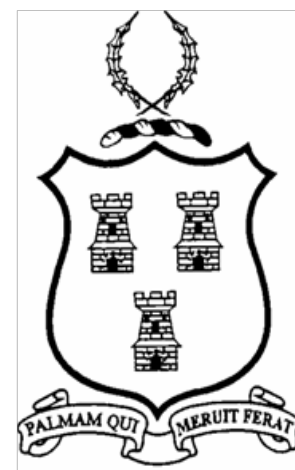

## Two Shakespeare Visits

At the end of the first term, two groups of pupils attended two separate productions of Shakespeare's plays. Some Grade 9s attended the U.C.T. production of "Romeo and Juliet" at the Little Theatre, and some Grade 10s the Westerford production of "Macbeth". The following are excerpts from the pupils' impressions:

Nicky de Villiers (C1) on "Macbeth": "The play as a whole was very entertaining and well-acted – particularly Lady Macbeth and Macduff who spoke their lines with conviction. The costumes were very realistic with much use of tartan plaids. Scenes of Scottish scenery and castles were projected onto the back of the stage increasing the sense of reality. The experience will prove to be a great help in all our "Macbeth" assessments this year.

Lauren Denny (B3) on Romeo and Juliet": "Seeing and hearing the Old English words acted out for real made it easier to understand and gave them more meaning than simply reading in

class. The actors, who were university students, were very energetic and their costumes were amazing. The set was simple but effective with one balcony and a staircase. Watching the play made the story-line of two teenagers falling in love, getting married and then finally dying for each other, seem more believable.

Editor's note: What a pity more girls did not take up this wonderful opportunity to see Shakespeare's works acted on the stage. The handful who did will really benefit from the experience.

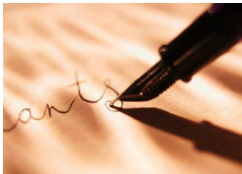

## News from the Music Department

### 10<sup>TH</sup> SAJE CONFERENCE 29-31 March 2010

The 10<sup>th</sup> South African Jazz Educators Conference was held at the SA College of Music from 29-31 March. This was an inspirational and exciting event.

The conference opened with Dennis Tini, Distinguished Professor of Music in Detroit, conducting a session exploring creative and spontaneous interactive accompanying concepts involved in Duo playing. This was great fun, despite the daunting title, enhanced by Tini's current research into "The Brain in Music and the Martial Arts"! This was followed by Dr Lou Fischer's session on "As swings the rhythm section, so swings the band!"

Dr Fischer is the President-Elect of the Jazz Education Network and has performed in over 50 Broadway shows. The first trumpet workshop by Dr Gordon Vernick had many useful tips on how to practise. The afternoon consisted of a Big Band workshop with the UCT Big Band conducted by Steve Waterman, professor of Jazz Trumpet at Trinity College of Music in London.

He showed how a band can develop far more rhythmic precision. The first day concluded with a talk on "The art and science of time" by Ronan Guilfoyle from Ireland.

The second day began with the second trumpet workshop given by Steve Waterman, followed by a panel discussing present trends in jazz education, "Jazz embraces change ... it is ever evolving" and a presentation of the SAJE *Sisters in Sound* Mentorship programme, which included Monique Hellenberg. The afternoon included discussions on jazz education as well as a presentation on "Coaching Singers in the Jazz and Popular Styles: an Overview" by Gloria Cooper from Long Island University, New York.

The final day was devoted to workshops on bass and guitar (including *Mzansi* Bass: Cape Town), papers "Interfacing creativity and improvisation" by Marc Duby (Head of Department of Music, Rhodes University) as well as "JISA – new web resource", and Professor Mike Rossi's workshop demonstrating "How to develop a chromatic language for jazz improvisation from the Common Bebop practices."

There was a plethora of concerts at lunchtime and in the evenings featuring these outstanding, world-class musicians as well as local groups. The students who attended (Roslyn Sanby, Lauren Sanby, Saskea Jacobs, Gladys Kisela, Nikki Cathcart) as well as the teachers (Mesdames Davis, Dernier, Gordon, Jamey and Sole) were stimulated and inspired by the new ideas and creativity to which they were exposed.

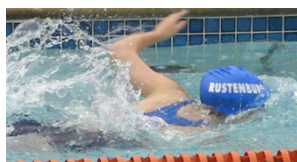

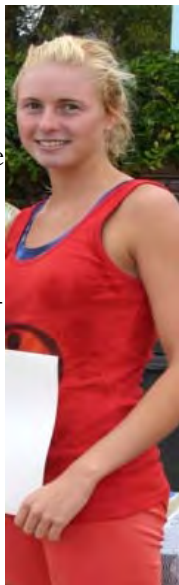
The race is due to start at 10h00 and the first swimmers will be arriving from 12h00.

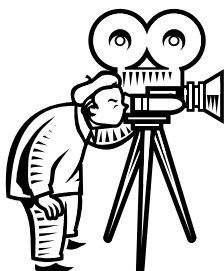

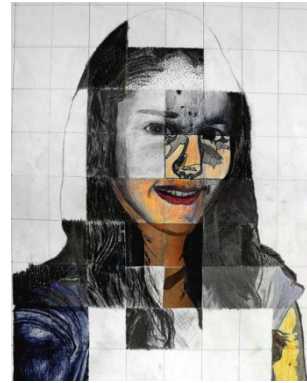
